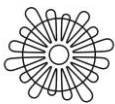
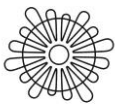

Se estudian los contenidos gramaticales y léxicos para que los estudiantes adquieran competencia comunicativa básica para poder desenvolverse en las situaciones cotidianas sencillas.

Preguntar cosas en clase, saludar y despedirnos: saludos y despedidas, las cosas de la clase. 3. Los números del 1 a 10, el abecedario, recursos para desenvolverse en la clase de español, entonación de preguntas parciales y su respuesta 4. Conocer mejor a las otras personas de la clase: dar y pedir datos personales, el género en nacionalidades y profesiones, los verbos <i>ser, tener y llamarse</i> 5.
