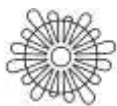

Course description	In the course German language A1.1 students acquire basic knowledge of the German language and its grammar. Simple expressions and sentences are practised which are necessary for everyday needs. The taught vocabulary includes personal information, numerals, hobbies, vacations, and food and drinks. Grammar is limited to personal pronouns and the present tense of verbs, definite and indefinite articles, possessive pronouns, modal verbs, as well as the nominative and accusative cases.
