# 3. Prerequisites

JHB 101 is a course for foreign students whose mother tongue is not Croatian. Student's level of Croatian should be at a beginner level.

#### 4. Course format and evaluation

The English for Specific Purpose class is based on the direct method, and uses the latest techniques in teaching a foreign language. During classes there will be use of a white board, overhead projector, LCD projector and other teaching aids. A number of classes will be held in language laboratories equipped with computers, which will have headphones and microphones. Evaluations will include homework and schoolwork (mid-term tests), as well as a final written and oral exam.

### 5. Course evaluations

During the semester the student will be required to complete 4 assignments/tests, each of which is worth 10% of the total written grade. At the end of the semester there will be a final written examination worth 60% of the total written grade, following the written examination the student will take an oral examination. The total results of the term assignments/tests and final written examination constitute 70% of the total course grade. The oral examination constitutes 20% of the total grade. Class participation (attendance, class activity, homework) constitutes 10% of the total grade. Grades for all assignments/tests, the written examination and the oral examination will be shown as percentages. In case a student does not complete one or more of the term assignments or tests, they will not be eligible to receive a signature from the course instructor, and will consequently lose the right to attend the final written exam.
